


Erasmus+ Youth in Action and the youth sector

Erasmus+ Youth in Action is the European Union's learning mobility programme for young people and youth work organisations, institutions and professionals. The programme promotes intercultural dialogue, non-formal learning, equity and inclusion¹. One specific objective is to foster quality development in youth work. Our research shows that Erasmus+ Youth in Action is successful in achieving this objective and contributes to "actively engaging youth organisations in the development, implementation and evaluation of policies affecting the lives of young people", one of the key principles² of the EU Youth Strategy 2019-2027.
