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1. MAIN EFFECTS ON YOUTH WORK

For 74% of the responding youth workers, the corona pandemic has affected their own youth work majorly.

Youth work activities and events have been affected most, and then to lesser extents: places and spaces and methods and tools. Youth work principles and values have been affected least – in comparison to our initial survey, these effects seem to have stabilised (youth workers and youth leaders reported principles and values to be affected considerably stronger in our initial survey).

Almost 83% of responding youth workers say that they are addressing the corona pandemic and its effects in their own youth work – a value that has remained steady over time.

Practical advice and online group activities are most frequently used to address the corona pandemic and its effects in youth work. Discussion of news and fake news, which had been offered least frequently in the first months of the pandemic, plays a more important role now.

2.ESTIMATING IMPACT ON CURRENT YOUTH WORK

Delays and interruptions have decreased somewhat, but for half of responding youth workers, 60% or more of their youth work remains delayed or interrupted. The median is 60,0% (down from 70,0% in August 2020).

While delays and interruptions have slowed down a little, the risk assessment of full cancellations has increased. In August 2020, more than 40% of all responding youth workers saw more than half of their current youth work activities at risk of being cancelled – this is now 50%. The median has changed from 40,0% to 50,0%.

Less than a third of all responding youth workers say that they have transferred up to half of their youth work to online environments. 6% say they have transferred all of their youth work to online environments, whereas 9% say they have not yet transferred anything online. The Median is 30%.

For a third of responding youth workers, 60% or more of the young people they normally work with are currently out of reach. Youth work has been able to reach slightly more young people as the pandemic continued, but the small number of responding youth workers who say they still reach all the young people they normally work with has further decreased (now at 5%).

3.STRUCTURAL IMPACT ON YOUTH WORK

Close to 50% of the responding youth workers say that the corona pandemic has affected their youth work structure majorly – and the impact has been growing over time.

4.BUDGETARY IMPACT ON YOUTH WORK

O » Overall, including any Corona-related financial support.

The budgetary impact of the pandemic differs considerably between levels of youth work. At local level, where youth work tends to be more stably financed, the financial impact of the pandemic has been less severe. In the context of international youth work, on the other hand, the budget has decreased for 60% of the responding organisations.

5. IMPACT ON YOUTH WORK TEAMS

The impact of the pandemic on teams has been profound. Working time of staff has decreased for a third of our survey respondents. Staff teams have been reduced for 17% of local youth work organisations and 36% of international youth work organisations. The impact on volunteering and for volunteers has been even more profound: For more than half of all respondents, overall engagement time of volunteers has decreased, and for almost half of all respondents the number of volunteers has decreased as well - with some variation between the spatial levels of youth work, as the table below shows.

6. RESPONSE OF YOUTH WORK

20% of responding youth workers consider the response of the youth work field to the crisis so far as very adequate, and 56% as somewhat adequate. 19% consider the response of the field as somewhat inadequate, and 5% as very inadequate.

7.RESPONSE OF EUROPEAN YOUTH WORK

16% of responding youth workers consider the response of **European** youth work to the crisis so far as very adequate, and 57% as somewhat adequate. 19% consider the response of the field as somewhat inadequate, and 8% as very inadequate.

10. SUPPORT OF YOUNG PEOPLE

Youth work helped young people to navigate the coronavirus pandemic and crisis in a number of important and relevant ways. Notably, youth work managed to help young people to recognise and deal with fake news somewhat less, compared to the other aspects of support.
